#### **Junior Science**

Our Junior pupils have been undertaking many science experiments during the Michaelmas Term.

Lower 2 (Year 4) have been busy exploring their new science topic: electricity. They started with one cell, two wires and a light. Then, after learning about the positive and negative ends to batteries and how to make a circuit, the children were able to increase the number of wires and lamps whilst still using just one cell.

Lower 3 (Year 6) were investigating physical and chemical changes. They went outside with Mr Bradley to have fun with a chemical change by making mini rockets. They mixed bicarbonate of soda and vinegar together to create carbon dioxide gas (and make the little canisters pop!) They learnt that this was an irreversible change.

Then, inside with Mrs Littlefield, they made mug cakes. They mixed ingredients together to form a batter and understood this was an irreversible, physical change. But once they were cooked, they learnt it was a chemical change as the batter had now become a delicious chocolate cake.

## **Design and Technology Victorian**

As part of their Design and Technology our Lower 3 (Year 6) pupils have been busy designing and making Victorian picture frames. Not only did they make the frames they also dressed up in Victorian costumes, posed and placed the pictures in the frames. Mrs Gregory, Design and Technology teacher thought they looked fantastic.

## Introducing the New School Councillors


Every academic year pupils across all parts of the school are invited to campaign to take on the role of school council representative. This is an important role and is based upon the votes of the pupils.

## **Duke of Edinburgh Awards**

More pupils than ever are participating in the Duke of Edinburgh Award at St John's. At the beginning of our Michaelmas Term 24 of our pupils in Upper 4 (Year 9) and Lower 5 (Year 10) took part in their Bronze Practice Expedition in fine weather. When it came to the actual assessment weekend, the weather was not so kind, our pupils certainly battled the elements to all achieve a pass for their expedition.

The Bronze Award consists of more than just an expedition. The pupils have to commit to a number of weeks of volunteering and are also required to learn a new skill as well as take part in a physical activity regularly. The scheme helps build confidence, independence and overall life skills.

In total 34 pupils have achieved their Bronze Award and this Summer four of our pupils attended Buckingham Palace to receive their Duke of Edinburgh Gold Awards, something very few young people achieve.

## **Trophies Galore at Chelmsford Festival**

St John's School, is celebrating after the largest number of pupils won awards at the Chelmsford Competitive Festival of Music Speech and Drama.

Pupils participated in group choral speaking, verse speaking, prose reading, Dickens reading, solo and duo acting. They were up against other children aged between five years to fifteen years. Not only were these enthusiastic pupils awarded Honours and Distinctions in many sections, they were also the recipients of twelve cups or trophies and there were many class winners.

Mrs Armour, Headmistress said "Music, Speech and Drama is an integral part of St John's School both within the curriculum and in extracurricular activities and lessons. Enormous congratulations go to all our pupils who so deservingly won these cups and trophies after much practice for the Festival". She added "Taking part in such events is a great way to increase pupil's confidence and presentation skills, both useful skills for their future".


With so many new pupils a Team Building Day was a great way for Upper 3 (Year 7) pupils to bond
